#### **Matters Discussed.**

1. The Chair for the Committee shall be Councillor MacDonald
2. The Draft Terms of Reference for the Committee were gone through and amendments agreed.
3. Discussion about the compiling and review of the Risk Register
4. The Play Area Service Level Agreements from Wrexham County Borough Council were given out and looked through.
5. The Play Area Contracts for the Play Areas were distributed and looked through and any comments noted:
6. Claypit Lane- the report identified a number of areas for resurface- low risk but will need something done
7. Noted that Wrexham Council inspect each week and carry out minor repairs but not large ones.
8. Issue of chains on swings at Claypit Lane needs to be looked at.
9. Allington Park: - Area around benches requires tarmacking
10. To ask for a quote for the benches resurfacing to be done the same time as work around the trust area to save on costs.
11. Issue of self-closing gate on High Street to be looked at.
12. Gresford Lake – it was raised that the white line on the step is not as visible as it should be. Councillor Dutton to speak to Marion. Possibly some luminous paint required.
13. Letter of thanks to go to Sarah Bellamy of Serendipity for the stone used to reinforce the banks.
14. J Dutton to undertake the work to repair the signage by lake. AB to arrange for sign to be taken down.
15. Discussion about matter raised by Scout Leader concerning spikes on the fence by the hut. To be looked at on site visit.
16. Discussion about grass cutting frequencies, costs and invoicing. A meeting is to be held with the grass cutter to discuss further.
17. Notice Board, Plaque and Seat. J Dutton gave information concerning a manufacturer and quotes received.
18. Discussion about possibility of plaques for seats, in memory of Councillor Graham Peake, and Mrs Evans who donated money for the upkeep of the lake.
